<p>Professor Li-Ling Tsai is currently a supervisory board member of the Society of Taiwan Women in Science and Technology (TWiST) and an associate professor teaching graduate students in gender studies and gender education in Taiwan. TWiST, established 2011, is Taiwan's biggest professional community for women in STEM and consists of hundreds of female scientists and engineers in all research fields from all over the country. Before Tsai completed her PhD, she obtained master's degrees in physics and gender studies in anthropology, was an optical engineer, and taught college physics for almost a decade. She has been advocating gender equality in science and technology for almost 20 years. In the past ten years, she has collaborated with the Taiwanese government to promote gender mainstreaming in STEM fields and served advisory boards of many high-rank government bodies including ministries of science and technology, education, and the human rights advisory board of the Taiwan President's Office. She is now leading a national project 'Gender in Science and Technology (GIST)' to promote gender equality and gendered innovations in the scientific research communities in Taiwan.
